## Veterinary Bill Assistance

It can be extremely scary and upsetting when our beloved pet falls traumatically injured or ill, and we cannot afford treatment. As much as HSoP would love to be able to assist pet owners with the cost of veterinary expenses, we are not able to at this time. Here are some resources that may be able to assist you with an emergency veterinary bill for your pet. Some are local, and others are larger organizations.

- Saving for a Storm ([savingforastorm.com](http://savingforastorm.com)) based out of Pullman, WA.
- Cooper Legacy Foundation ([CoopersLegacyFoundation.org](http://CoopersLegacyFoundation.org)) based out of Pullman, WA.
- Washington State University Veterinary Hospital-Has a “Good Samaritan” fund that may assist with owned pets’ procedures or treatment.
- Care Credit-A line of credit for immediate access.
- Waggle.com-A fundraising site specifically for veterinary bills of owned pets.
- FrankieFriends.com-Fund granting site for veterinary bills of owned pets.
- Bowwowbuddies.com-Fund granting site for veterinary bills of owned pets.
- RedRoverRelief.org-Fund granting site for veterinary bills of owned pets.

Many of these resources will require extensive information about you and your pet to ensure you are qualified to receive funding through their programs. Some things you should have readily available:

- Your household income for the past two months, or your annual income for the previous year, to show that you need assistance in affording your veterinary bill
- A current estimate of the veterinary bill from your veterinarian. The name, address, and animal information must match your funding application information.
  - This estimate will need to list the diagnosis, treatment plan, and survival rates determined by your veterinarian.
- Available funds that you have access to for this veterinary bill (Savings, personal loans, and other funding assistance.)
