Is there anything we should know about you?

Thank you for your interest in volunteering at HSoP, and choosing to donate your time to our organization and the homeless pets in our shelter. Volunteers are a vital part in our efforts to continue helping those who cannot help themselves.

We have established a set of guidelines and rules for HSoP volunteers to follow. All rules are in place to provide a safe and welcoming environment to all HSoP animals and visitors. All HSoP volunteers are required to follow both verbal and written instructions provided by HSoP staff. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary actions up to termination of the privilege of volunteering. These instructions are designed to ensure your volunteer shift is enjoyable, safe, and productive.

Our organization sees a variety of breeds and species, and all of them come from various backgrounds. Some animals may have been mistreated, or suffer from fear and anxiety. Please be mindful of our animal's well-being, and offer them space if they are showing signs of distress. Distress in dogs can be shown by growling, barking loudly, or tucking their tails. Distress in cats can be shown by growling, hissing, or hiding. Please respect their boundaries. Understand that if you put your hands/fingers/ feet/etc. in a kennel with an unknown animal, you may not get those back. HSoP will not be held liable should any actions you take while volunteering result in an injury.

Junior volunteers are able to volunteer for a one-hour shift at a time without their parent or guardian. Parent or guardian are required to attend the first volunteer shift with the child to ensure all rules and guidelines are understood. Volunteers under the age of 18 are unable to interact with our dogs, unless a parent or guardian is with them.
